



WHAT TO DO ABOUT THE WEAK ONES? (2)

What are we to do about Christians who are different? That is the question Paul is dealing with in Romans 14 and 15. So far (verses 1–4) we have learned that we must open our hearts to them as we would to a friend. We mustn't keep trying to put them right, we mustn't look down on them and we mustn't judge them. In Romans 14:5 – 13 Paul continues on the same theme.

◆ Are there any outstanding issues on which you ought to be convinced in your own mind? What are they?

◆ Now that you are conscious of these issues, what will it mean for you in practice?
